### STRENGTHENING CHILD PROTECTION IN HEALTH NZ

Health NZ Te Whatu Ora has established a Child Protection Clinical Governance Group (CGG) to strengthen and coordinate child protection efforts within Health NZ and in partnership with other ministries.

The CGG includes PSNZ Child Protection CRG members Patrick Kelly, Miranda Ritchie, Leanne Franklin, and Heather Muriwai, with Russell Wills serving as Chair. Senior Health NZ executives are actively involved, including:

#### **Key Focus Areas**

The CGG is currently working on:

- Developing a Child Protection Policy for Health NZ
- Health NZ joining the Child Protection Protocol with Police & Oranga Tamariki
- Enhancing information sharing in child protection
- Improving the model of care in Oranga Tamariki residences

With just two meetings so far, it's clear that priorities across organisations and between policy and clinical leaders are well aligned. Expect to see opportunities for clinical engagement in many of these workstreams—we'll be reaching out for your input!
